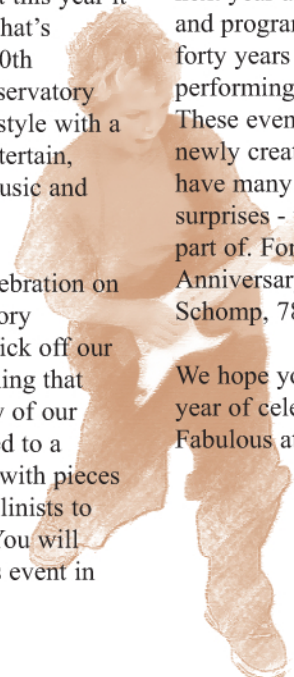
Celebrating 40 Years

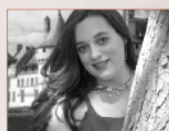

BaYS CONCLUDES THIRD SEASON

Bay Youth Symphony (BaYS) completed its third season with a final concert, sponsored by Newfield House, on Sunday, May 2, at the Duxbury Performing Arts Center. More than 120 students, from 23 South Shore communities participated in three, leveled, orchestras. Two chamber ensembles within BaYS continued this year. The Honors String Quartet was coached by SSC violin instructor, Katherine Roussopoulos. SSC bassoon teacher, Janet Underhill, coached the Honors Woodwind Quintet. Both chamber ensembles are comprised of selected BaYS Symphony students, and performed at each BaYS concert as well as at SSC functions. They will also be performing at the Newfield House in Plymouth. James Vinci, Orchestra Director for the Duxbury Schools, continues as BaYS Music Director and Conductor of the Symphony. Nicholas Tatarka, Orchestra Director for the



Medfield public schools conducts the Sinfonia, and Theresa Fritz, strings specialist with the Pembroke schools, directs the elementary Dolce Strings. Steven Karidoyanes, Music Director for the Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra is the Artistic Advisor for BaYS. Candace Kniffen, retired Director of Music and Orchestra Director for the Marshfield Public Schools, is the Managing Director of BaYS.

We are pleased and proud to report that each of the first two years of BaYS, more than 95% of those students eligible to return - those who did not yet graduate from high school - chose to do so.
