group of nervous youngsters sang from their hearts, touching hundreds of attendees and officials. Days later Pure Treble performed the choral portion of *Music Is...*, Composer John Kramer's musical celebration of the Conservatory's 40th anniversary, at the Duxbury Performing Arts Center.

After the success of its inaugural year, Pure Treble director Kathy McMinn has expanded the program to include an older level. Pure Harmony chorus is for
